## Feed Our Scholars - Help Wanted

The program providing weekend food to elementary school students has started up as the school year is underway. There are four ways you can help with this program which is supporting over forty elementary school students. First, weekly bagging of food takes a little more than an hour a week and can be scheduled to fit your own schedule. Second, delivery of the bags happens on Thursday mornings around ten o'clock, which means loading totes of the food bags into cars/trucks, then driving them to the school. Third, monthly delivery of food happens at 7:15 AM every third Tuesday, when we unload a pallet of boxed food from Good Shepherd Food Bank and store it in our FOS closet. Fourth, bring your returnable bottles and cans and drop them in the box under the mailboxes in the hallway; the money from these helps us buy the food we need from Good Shepherd. #### Church in Society's Fall Book Discussion

There is still time to put Church in Society's book discussion of <u>The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World</u> by the 14th Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu and Carlton Abrams on your calendar! <u>The Book of Joy</u> is the result of a 7-day meeting between the Dalai Lama and Desmond Tutu, two of the world's most influential spiritual leaders, during which they discussed one of life's important questions: "How do we find joy despite suffering?"

"Envisioned as a gift to the world to celebrate the Dalai Lama's 80th birthday, <u>The Book of Joy</u> is structured as a three-layer cake that aims to provide a practical foundation for cultivating and sustaining joy." Church in Society will break the book into three sections and have three sessions on the following dates: You can still join us on Oct. 17, and Nov. 21 from 7:00-8:00pm. We are using Zoom at the preent time for these meetings, and Rev. Oscar Wallace is leading the discussion.
